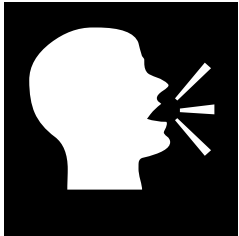


# Attending Body Code in Conversation Visual Guide

## Key information



Body Code in Conversation is an event being held on Wednesday the 18th of September.

This event is focused on people talking together about disability and technology.



The event is being held at the Queensland University of Technology, Gardens Point Campus. I may see the name of the university written as QUT.

The event is scheduled to start at 6:15 PM. I can arrive anytime from 6:00 PM onwards.

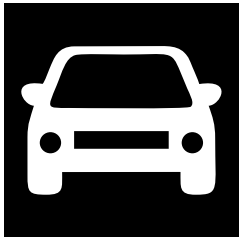
The event is scheduled to end at 7:45 PM but may go for longer. I can leave at any time, even if the event is still running.

This event is informal and I can wear casual clothes that are comfortable. There is no dress code.

I do not need to make a reservation or buy a ticket to attend.

I can bring a carer or friend with me to the event. They also do not need to buy a ticket or make a reservation.

# Getting to the event via car



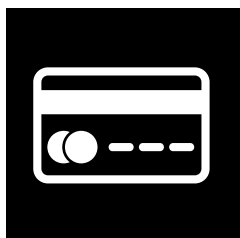
The event address is QUT, Gardens Point Campus.

The event is being held in room D108 which is located on the ground floor of D block. D block is marked with a red circle and arrow on the map.



I can drive a car and park in one of the university car parks. Carpark P has the best access to the event. Carpark P is marked with a yellow arrow on the map.

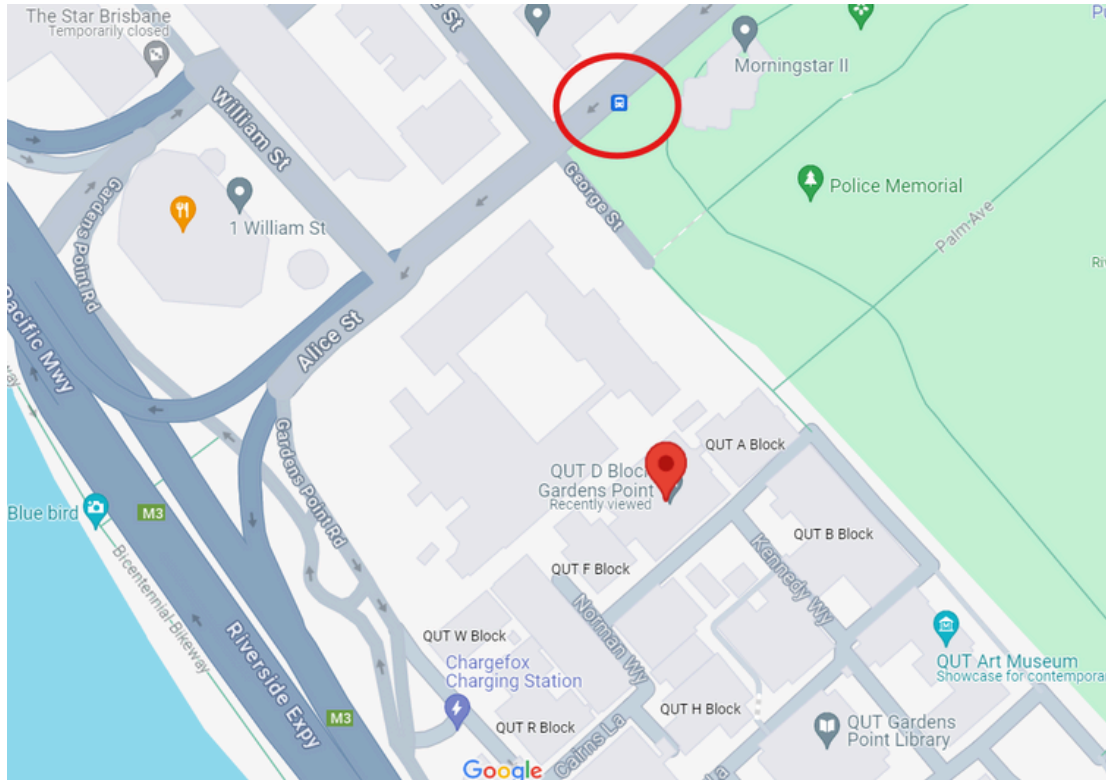
There are marked and signed disabled parking spots in this carpark.



Car parking costs \$5 per hour. When the event is finished I will need to pay for my parking with a bank card when exiting the car park.

I will need to walk from carpark P to D block. This walk is approximately 500m.

# Getting to the event via public transport



The closet public transport station to the event is a bus stop. The stop is: Alice Street Stop 95 near George St. This stop has been circled in red in the above map.



I will need to walk from the bus stop to the event. This walk is approximately 200 metres.

The QUT campus will have university students and other members of the public walking around but should not be too crowded.

I can look for signs with QUT on them to help direct me.

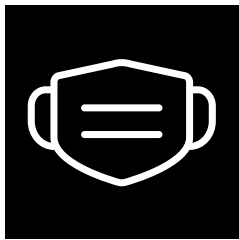


# Arriving at the event



The conversation is being held in a room at QUT. The room has carpet and florescent lights.

Someone will greet me when I arrive to the event. I don't need to show them a ticket.



Chairs in the room will be arranged in a circle.

I can choose any chair to sit in or I can chose to stand.



Between 15 - 40 other people will be attending the event and may arrive at different times.

I can choose to wear a face mask if I want.

Smoking is not allowed at QUT.

# During the event



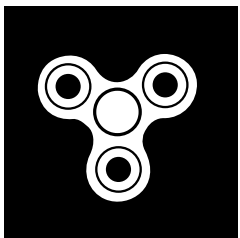
During the event key speakers will sit or stand in the circle, visible to everyone, and talk about the project Body Code.

I can choose to sit or stand and can walk around if I need to.

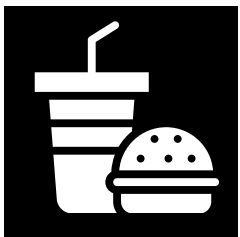


I can attract attention and make a comment or ask a question at any time.

At times the key speakers will ask for people in the circle to share their thoughts. I can choose to answer or I can stay silent.



I can bring and use any devices to help with sensory sensitivities. For example fidget devices or headphones.



Some light snacks will be provided I can help myself and eat at any time. I can also bring my own food and drinks from home if I want.

I can leave the event room at any time.



There will be an Auslan interpreter present.
