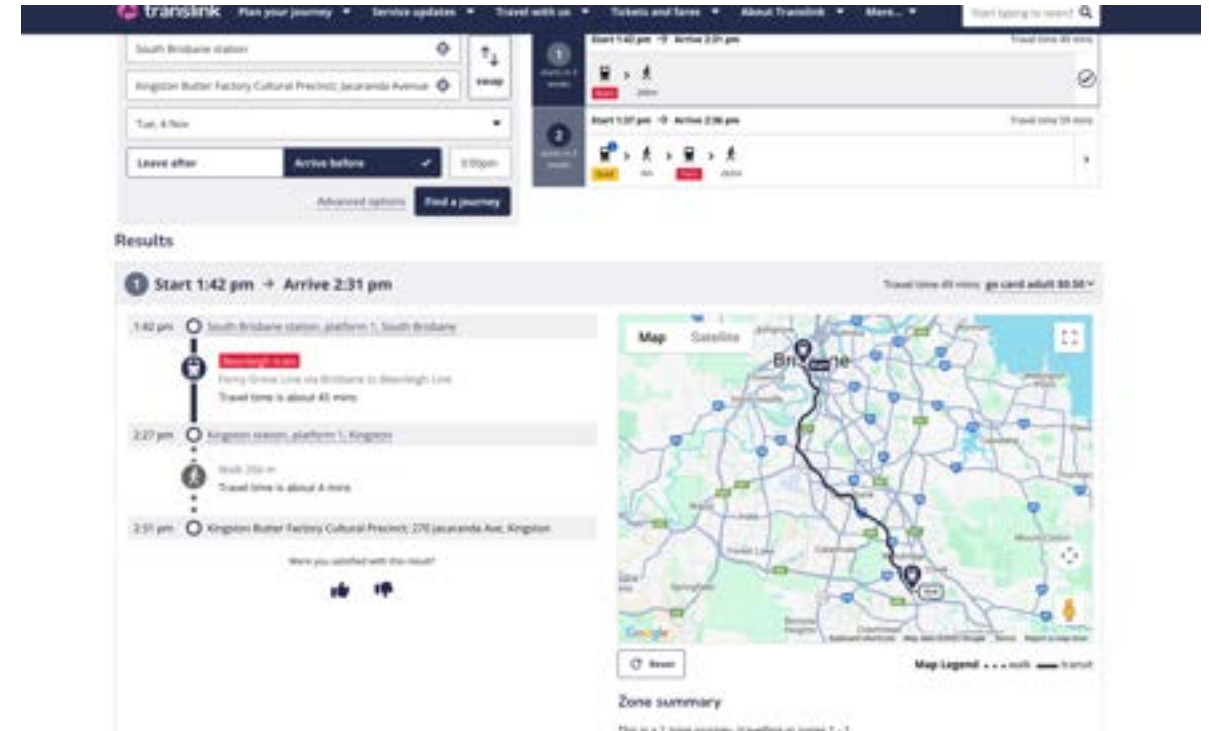

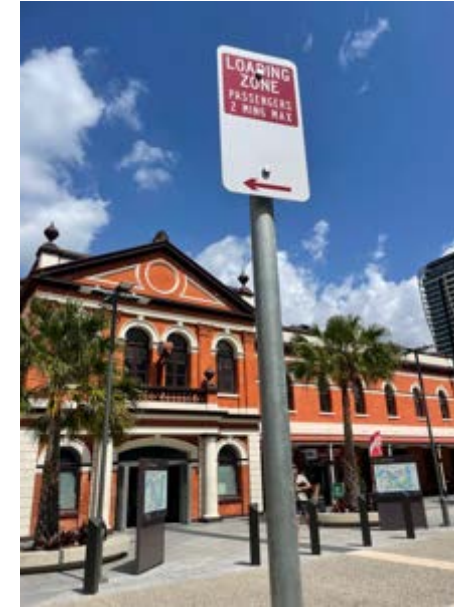
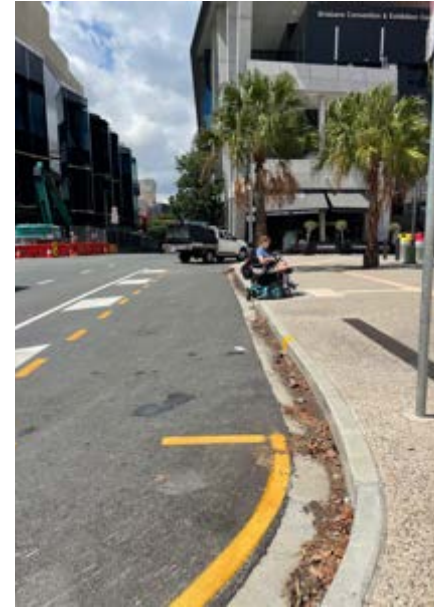
Arrive 15 minutes before your train

trip details



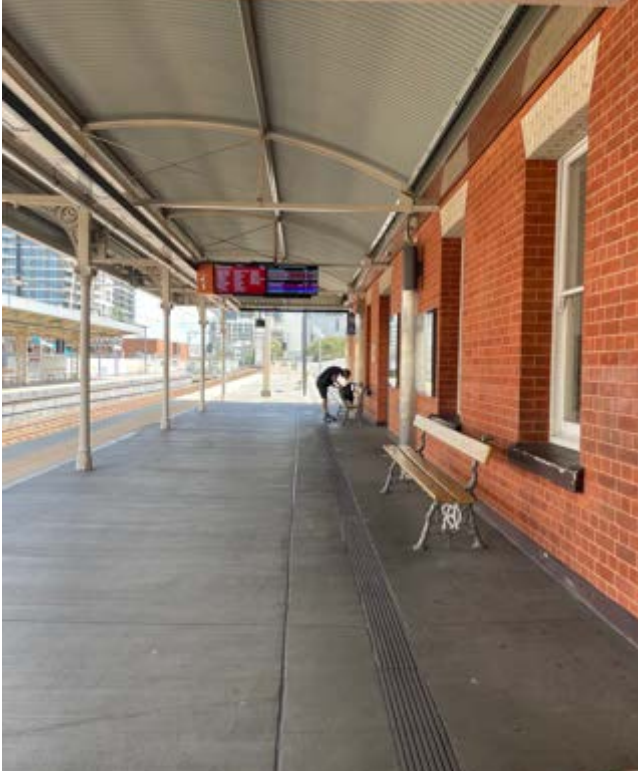
You can go up to the platform by using the lift or stairs



Let's go up in the lift

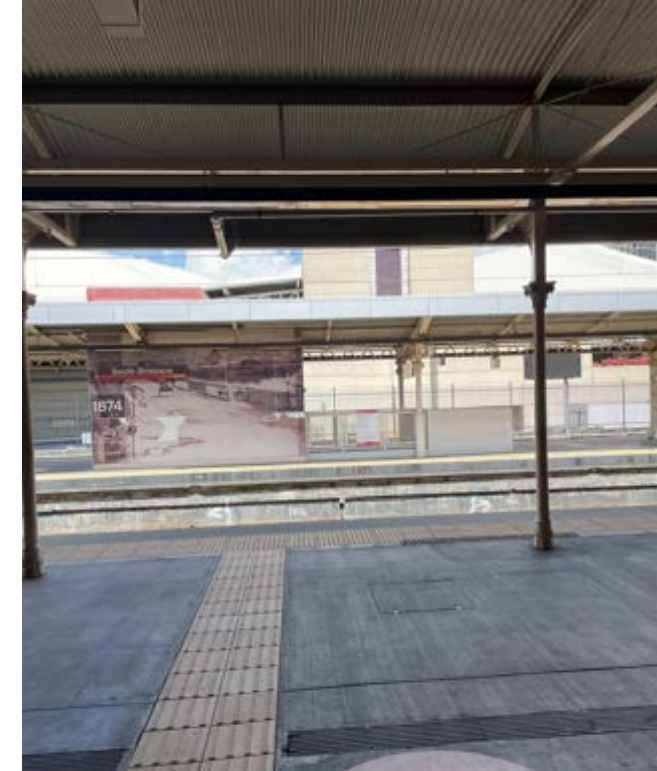


We are on the platform –

but energizing to be going.

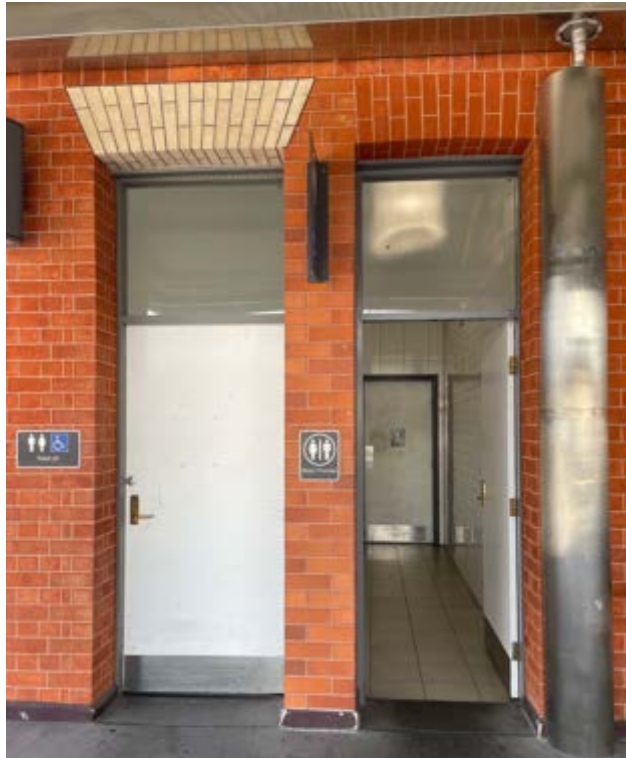


There is a help station if you need assistance

wheelchair sign



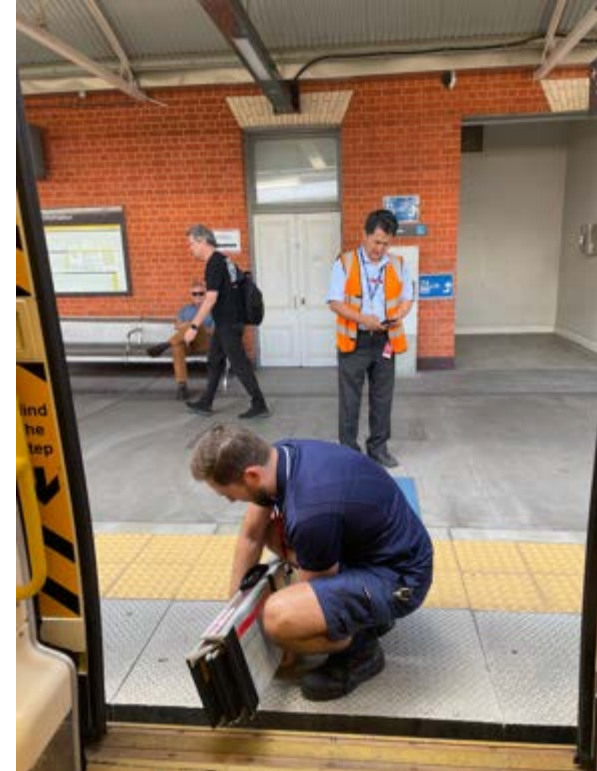
When the train arrives train staff will come with the ramp, they will ask you 'where are you are getting off? '

I hear other people talking and a whistle noise to tell the train to go.

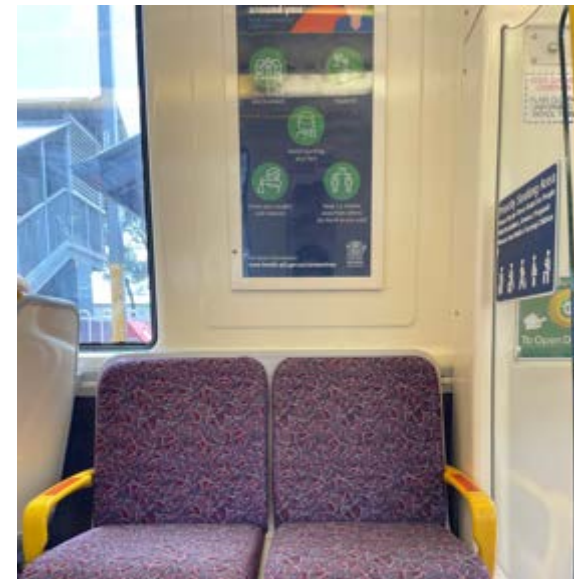
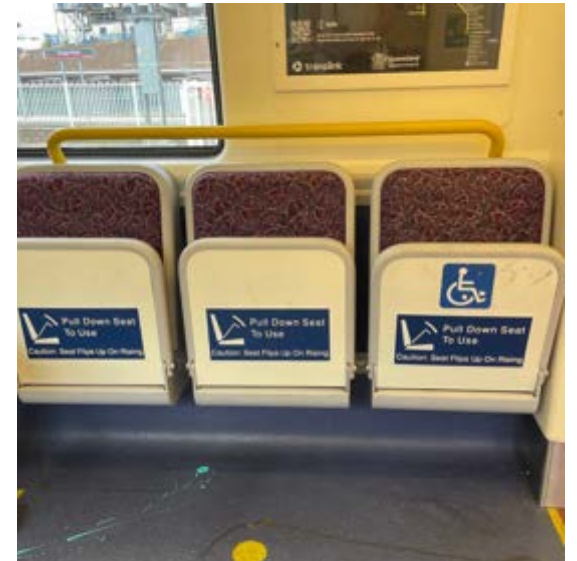


There is a wheelchair space and seating options- choose a spot

I feel the cool air con, and I am excited to be on my way.



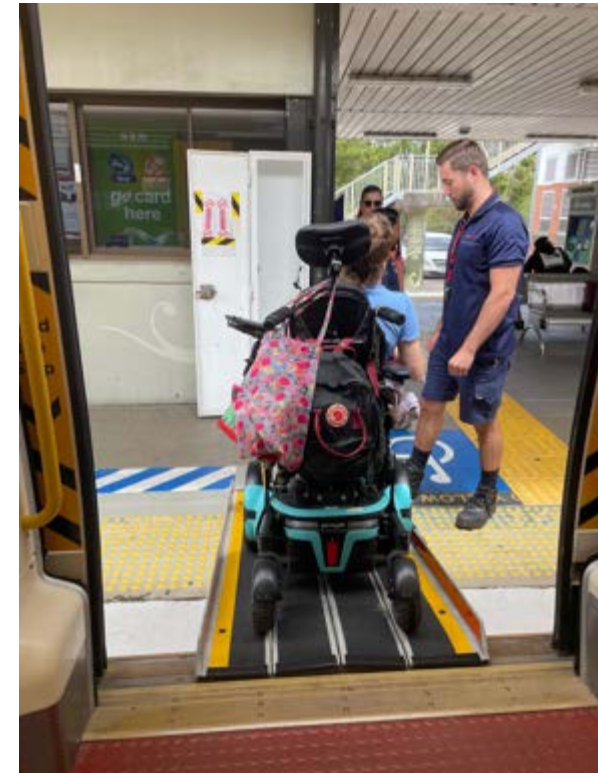
Get off at Kingston

Go to the lift and go up



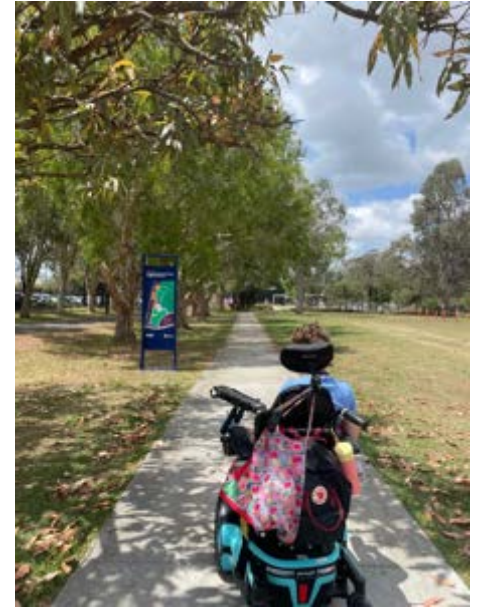
Head down the ramp

Hot tip: Do not put walking trip in google maps, it gives the wrong direction....

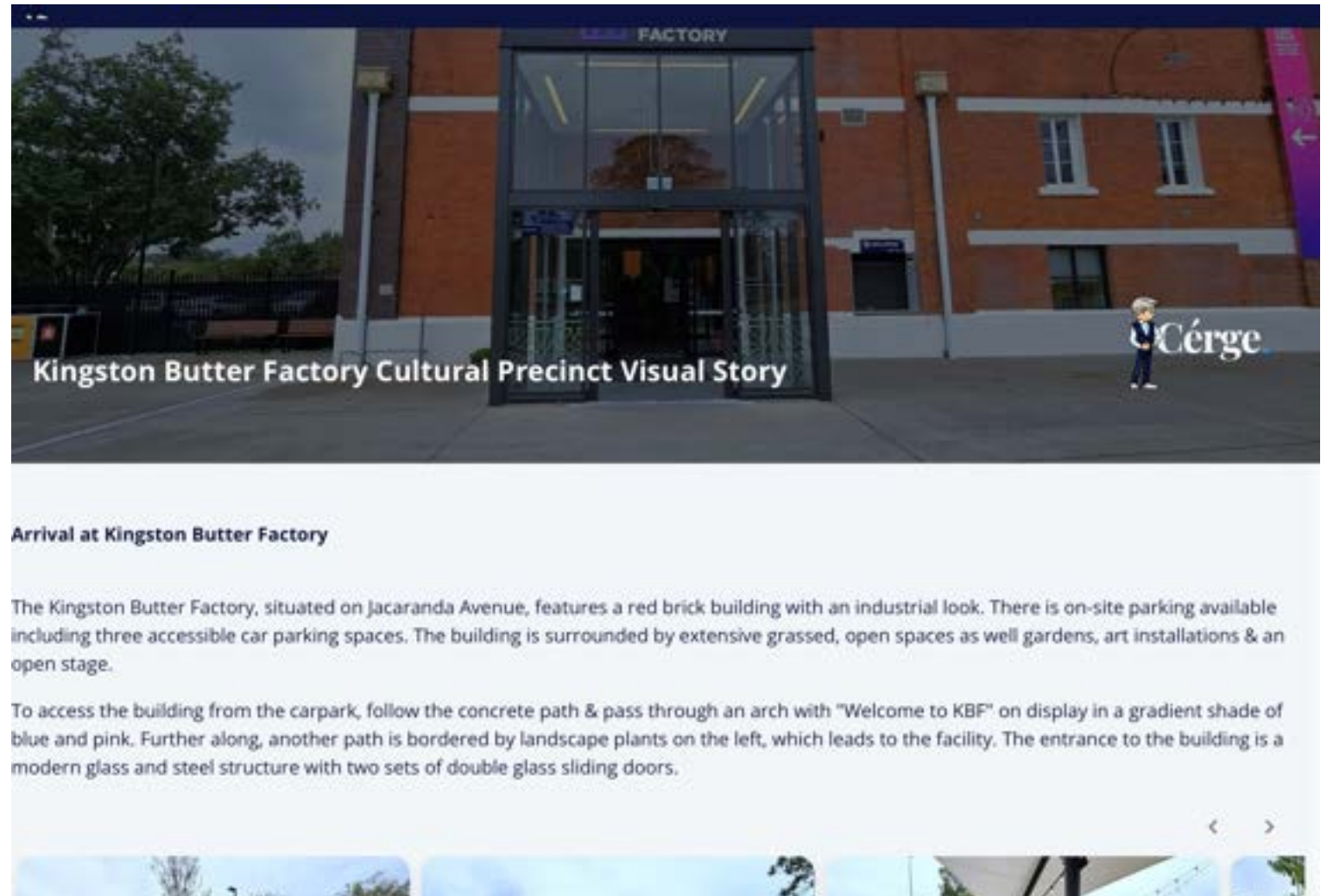
You walk past the museum and play group to get to the venue.

There are creative things to see when you arrive and a great café.

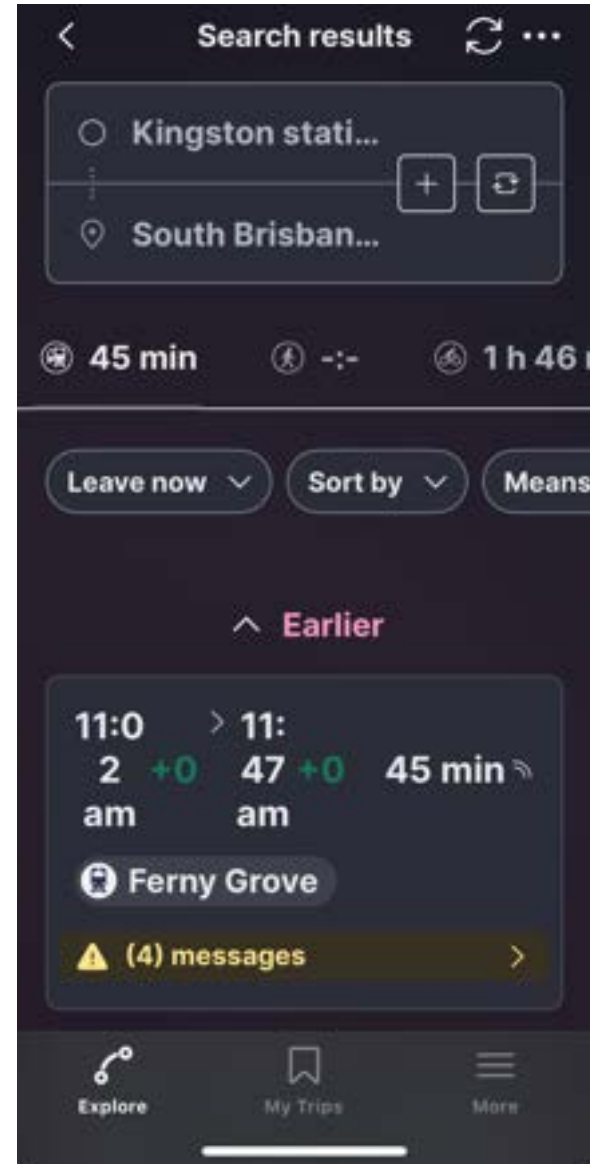


After the amazing show prepare to walk back to Kingston Train Station

Tap on with card or phone, or buy a ticket



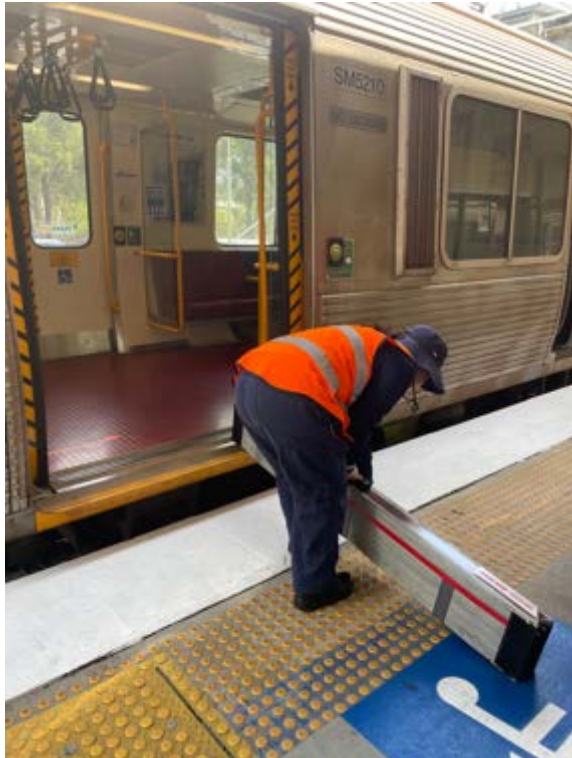

Getting on

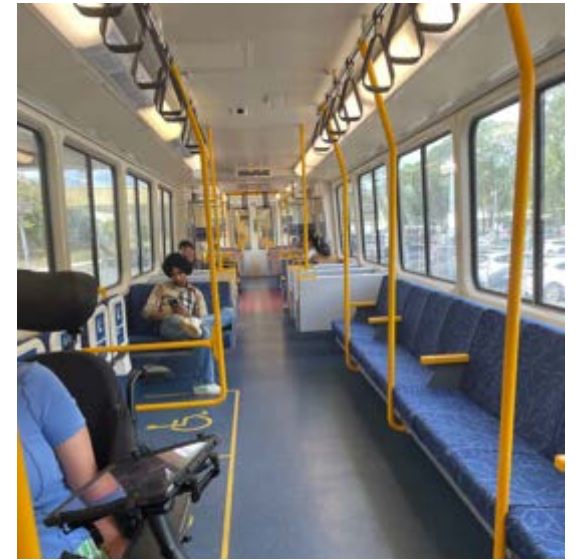


There is a wheelchair space and seating options- choose a spot
